- Program Evaluation:
  - This course provides students with an introduction to program evaluation concepts, strategies and methods, and I focus on giving students opportunities to apply what they learn in class to clinical and macro social practice.

  - Required course for MSW student in child welfare track. This course provides an
    overview of physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional development throughout
    childhood, as well as major theories that are commonly used to conceptualize
    development. I encourage students to apply class topics to their social work practice
    with children and families.

  - First of two required research-focused MSW courses. I provide students with an introduction into research concepts and methods, and specifically relate them to social work practice and social work research.
- Social Welfare Policy & Services II: Violence Against Women & Children
  - Second of two required policy-focused MSW courses. This advanced policy course
    provided students with a foundational understanding of how policy around violence
    against women and child have evolved throughout the history of U.S. politics.
    Students learned how to analyze and critique current policies with an intersectional
    lens
- Advanced Contemporary Policy: Interpersonal Violence
  - Second of two required policy-focused MSW courses. This course was a modified and updated version of SWPS II (above). In this course, students focused on learning about social welfare policies concerning different types of interpersonal violence, such as intimate partner violence, hate crimes, and human trafficking. Students learned how to critically analyze and evaluate policies' effectiveness and unintended consequences from a feminist, anti-racist and intersectional perspective.
- Understanding Violence & Abuse in Adulthood
  - Second of two required human development courses. This advanced course provided students with a deep dive into theories on the causes of violence and abuse committed by and to adults. Coursework also focused on applying theories and evidence-based interventions to real world social problems, and how violence and abuse may impact their social work practice.
