- Planned and executed weekly community service projects for high school students in a South Bronx high school to strengthen their emerging leadership and civic engagement
- Created and facilitated service learning and social justice lessons on topics such as homelessness, mental health, voting rights, and healthy relationships in the classroom to encourage students to lead their communities; created relevant service projects attached to each hour-long lesson
- Recruited 300 students to engage in 975 hours of service each month by developing student, administration, teacher, and community partner relationships

- Co-led and co-created the curriculum for a Black History Month-themed service day for 100+students to celebrate black lives, black culture, and black female empowerment by engaging in various art and reflection projects
- Co-led an 8-day long service trip for 14 high school students around the country to build the foundation of a school in a rural Guatemala community. Developed relationships with local community members and facilitated conversations around privilege and social justice with students, including a gender talk among our female participants and Guatemalan women

- Trained new AmeriCorps members how to successfully implement large-scale schoolwide events by introducing them to planning and organizing documents, how to facilitate team meetings, and tools to assess their successes and areas of growth
- Facilitated a training I co-designed for 27 City Year Team Leaders for effective ways to best teach their corps members how to better manage their time, organize their documents, and become stronger tutors and mentors
- Recruited 25% more students than previous year and met enrollment goal of 60 students in an after school program faster than any other City Year school in New York; wrote, filmed, and edited a recruitment video encouraging students to join after school program
- Acted as a Program Coordinator for a three-day Spring Break event for 100+students across the Bronx and Harlem, organizing field trips and curriculum and planning a carnival, pep rally, talent show, and graduation ceremony; directly supervised six AmeriCorps members to support with coordination

- Managed the logistics of our daily after school program for 65+ students to ensure safety and enrichment
- Edited program curriculum for after school program, coached corps members to strengthen their facilitation skills, and established community partners for extra support
- Facilitated daily literacy interventions for three sixth grade students at first grade reading levels, resulting in increased reading levels of 1.5-2 years
