Course of Study

BASW Program

- Complete two semesters of field education for a total of 480 hours
- Participate in field 16 hours per week for fifteen weeks, each semester
- Must receive one hour per week of educationally focused supervision by a qualified field instructor
- Participate in an integrative field seminar

MSW Program

- Students in the 57 credit MSW Program complete 960 hours over 4 semesters
- Students in the 38 credit Advanced Standing Program complete 600 hours over 2.5 semesters (July - April)
- Participate in field 16 hours per week for fifteen weeks each semester
- Must receive one hour per week of educationally focused supervision by a qualified field instructor
- Participate in an integrative field seminar



How do field coordinators determine where students are matched?

Matches are determined by the field coordinator for each program based on location, agency availability and student requests/learning needs, as outlined in the field application.

Field Instructor Qualifications

- For undergraduate students, the instructor must possess a baccalaureate degree or extensive social services practice experience
- For graduate students, instructors must possess a master of social work degree and have two years post-masters experience (LMSW preferred but not required)

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
